NC DIGITAL GOVERNMENT SUMMIT

Students from the Digital Ambassadors and Tech Teams programs shared their experience with the programs on a panel at the NC Digital Government Summit this week in Raleigh. Moderated by NC Department of Information Technology Secretary Jim Weaver, the students highlighted how their participation in these programs has impacted both their community and their future career paths and employment prospects. The Digital Ambassadors team from Alamance County, a bilingual group focused on assisting Spanish speakers, discussed how they are bridging the digital divide in their community by utilizing their language skills to work with the Hispanic/Latinx population. The Tech Teams from Beaufort County and Governor Morehead School for the Blind and Deaf shared their unique contributions, with Beaufort students showcasing their work in technology repairs for the entire county and Governor Morehead students focusing on how their work repairing braille readers for visually impaired peers has positively impacted their school. Together, these teams exemplify the power of student-led initiatives in enhancing digital literacy and accessibility statewide.
